

CBFANC and the East Oakland Stadium Alliance move to protect Port of Oakland

On May 13th, Port of Oakland Port Commissioners convened a special hearing o their adoption of 4 year plan to allow Oakland As to meet requisites to their dream waterfront Ballpark at Howard Terminal site. Among the stipulations:

- A completed environmental impact report on the stadium proposal;
- Land use approvals from various public agencies; and
- Real estate agreements with the Port and others.

The 7 member Port Commission vote was unanimous for approval to go forward. This follows the April 23rd unanimous vote by the Alameda County Board of Supervisors' to approve their ballpark term sheet with the Oakland As for the potential purchase of the county's 50% interest in the current As stadium for \$85 million. As reported earlier, CBFANC has joined PMSA, HTA, ILWU and other agencies to make sure our concerns are heard. For the May 13th Port Commissioners special meeting, ILWU and others held a rally with full press before the meeting and CBFANC joined at meeting to voice our concerns about the "sweetheart deal" the As are scoring. Although the Port Commission was unanimous in approving the As term sheet, the Port Commissioners did add an important amendment: "The Port emphasized that the Board's vote does not commit the Port to the ballpark project. It said no binding agreements would be considered before the A's meet their obligations." With this amendment, the Board affirmed their commitment that the ballpark project cannot interfere with Port operations. The amendment also made the statement: "The Port will consult seaport and maritime stakeholders regarding such measures".

What's next? On May 23rd there was an agenda meeting at Oakland City Council. Along with PMSA and ILWU, CBFANC advanced concerns about handing over a single developer (the As organization) two parcels of City land for the ballpark development. We were encouraged to find that the Council reinstated previously tabled critical discussions on the ballpark proposal and that the topic will be back on the agenda for their June meeting. At the June 4, 2019 Oakland City Council meeting we will press our case that it would be shortsighted to grant the Howard Terminal site to developers intent on building the proposed As stadium and luxury condominiums project.

CBFANC is a member of the East Oakland Stadium Alliance. The coalition realizes Oakland is in difficult position with loss of Raiders and Warriors from Oakland. However the City and Port of Oakland bear a huge responsibility to ensure the maritime services will not be impacted from careless profiteering by land-grabbers who do not have longtime Oakland residents interests at heart.

Per Info Notice 728-19-06 dated April 26, 2019, SFO Customs notified all CES exams to be conducted at PCC Logistics. CBP contact numbers:

On May 14, 2019, CBFANC Customs and Ocean Committee met with CBP and PCC Logistics at Oakland to discuss CES progress and process. Productive discussion on PCC's extended warehouse space and hours committed to handle the volume as the sole CES for Oakland. An updated contact list was provided and attached. Following are main points:

- CBP reminded earlier filing of entries is optimum practice. This will enable CBP to provide entry number on PT to facilitate PCC to contact broker of record.
- CET (NII) exams are conducted at port terminals by 3rd day or broker should check status. If CET designates PT for further exam, PCC will dray same day
- Exam times: PCC has worked with Customs to support extended operation hours and multiple seal checks daily.
- Contact list updated
- Truck D.O. Assignment: PCC will necessarily require a delivery order for Trade or CBP Agriculture exams. (CET exams are dispatched by CES)
- Freight release/payments: PCC takes PayCargo and credit card. Due to increased volume, PCC is no longer accepting check copy. By summer PCC hopes to add additional option for payment link through their website.
- Necessary documents for release:
- Delivery Order
- Freight Release
- Equipment Interchange
- Customs Release (ABI results)
- Payment
- Overweights: Standard through carrier manifest documents or, if asked, scale ticket

USDA to move S.F. Plant Inspection Station effective June 4, 2019

IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM USDA – <u>Move of S.F. Plant</u> <u>Inspection Station effective June 4, 2019</u>

This message is being sent to our regular local customers. The information provided is directed primarily to the import community, although there is information pertinent to all of our customers. Please take the time read the attached information, and share with others as needed.

Effective June 4, 2019, the USDA PPQ San Francisco Plant Inspection Station will be located at **560 Eccles Avenue.** The new location has a truck dock with 3 doors containing dock levelers, one with a dock lift and one street height delivery door.

Importers will be required at the new location to offload 100% of all import shipments into our facility <u>and</u> provide ALL labor, including pulling and presenting samples required as directed by PPQ Staff, repacking, sealing and removal from the facility. <u>This now</u> <u>includes maritime containers that were previously</u> <u>exempt at the current facility due to limited space and</u> <u>the ability to unload entire containers.</u>

Brokers are <u>strongly</u> encouraged to work with importers, and they in turn with their suppliers. Risk Based Sampling will require random sampling and in many cases these samples will be larger. Importers are also <u>strongly</u> encouraged to work with suppliers to organize and clearly number boxes/containers so that they can be easily found and presented to an inspector.

5% Duty on All Imports from Mexico!

5% Duty on all Imports from Mexico + Action on USMCA

From FBB Federal Relations - *Two things related to Mexico:*

- 1. President Trump sent the following tweet roughly an hour ago: "On June 10th, the United States will impose a 5% Tariff on all goods coming into our Country from Mexico, until such time as illegal migrants coming through Mexico, and into our Country, STOP. The Tariff will gradually increase until the Illegal Immigration problem is remedied ... at which time the Tariffs will be removed. Details from the White House to follow."We have learned that the President's tweets cannot be ignored. We are working to gain additional insight.
- 2. We are also running down information about this there are reports that the Trump Administration is sending a draft of the "Statement of Administrative Action" to Capitol Hill today. The move would represent a procedural step forward on the path to approve the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement and starts a 30-day window that must pass before the Trump administration is allowed to submit the full implementing legislation to Congress. Based on what we have heard on the Hill this

week, the Speaker is unlikely to respond favorably to this move, if rumors are true.

If the Administration is moving forward, it is no doubt in response to Mexican President Andrés Manuel López Obrador announcing today that Mexico will begin the process of ratifying the USCMA, one day after legislation was introduced in Canada to implement the agreement.

White House Trade Announcements Explained

Continuing Barrage of White House Trade Announcements – Explained Peter Friedmann and Ray Bucheger May 31, 2020

Mexico Tariffs: A <u>statement</u> from the White House that was issued after President Trump's tweet provided additional information: "...If the illegal migration crisis is alleviated through effective actions taken by Mexico, to be determined in our sole discretion and judgment, the Tariffs will be removed. If the crisis persists, however, the Tariffs will be raised to 10 percent on July 1, 2019. Similarly, if Mexico still has not taken action to dramatically reduce or eliminate the number of illegal aliens crossing its territory into the United States, Tariffs will be increased to 15 percent on August 1, 2019, to 20 percent on September 1, 2019, and to 25 percent on October 1, 2019. Tariffs will permanently remain at the 25 percent level unless and until Mexico substantially stops the illegal inflow of aliens coming through its territory..."
